By taking a daily inventory of ourselves, we are able to review the events of our day, see the positive and negative things we may have done, and figure out what action needs to be taken in order to grow within our recoveries.

When preparing to perform your daily inventory, ask God to reveal any areas within your recovery that He would like for you to work on. Psalm 139:23-24 says, "Search me, God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting."
