Alzheimer's Education and Caregiver Support

One in ten people over age 65 live with Alzheimer's disease. Of course, this disease touches many members of our church family and our community as a patient, a loved one, or as a caregiver. The Care & Counseling Ministry is launching a series of educational presentations and a support group for caregivers of a loved one living with Alzheimer's.

On Tuesday, July 30, from 6:30-8 p.m., we will offer a presentation called "Understanding Alzheimer's." All are welcome to attend. You will learn about the impacts of Alzheimer's disease, the difference between Alzheimer's and dementia, the stages of Alzhiemer's and risk factors, current research and treatments offered to address some symptoms, and Alzheimer's Association resources. Our presenter will be Herb Magley, a volunteer from the Alzheimer's Association. Herb has been a caregiver for multiple family members who have had Alzheimer's, including his wife. Herb has been instrumental in establishing several support groups for caregivers in our area and is a speaker nationwide for the Alzheimer's Association. Herb's experiences and insights, alongside his love and support of caregivers, have positioned him to be a valuable speaker to learn from, as many of us are touched by Alzheimer's.
