#### A Vision for our Citv

Last week we talked about a vision for our city. The map below represents the five miles surrounding our church building. 65,000

people live in this area. According to a recent survey, an astonishing 30.8% of people in this area identify their religious preference as "None." This means around 19.000 people surrounding our building do not believe in Jesus or go to church. This isn't our nation at large, this is our own backyard!



This year, we want to change that number

by reaching our city in the name of Jesus. We plan to tackle this project in three phases: Get Stronger. Get Ready. Get to Work. This fall we plan to focus on strengthening our own relational infrastructures to poise ourselves to receive more people later in the year. In the winter, we will train and educate ourselves on how to do outreach in today's postmodern, post-truth, post-Christian climate. Then, we plan to go to work with three events as premiere vehicles to reach our city. First, Christmas Eve 2019. Second, a community outreach event featuring author, Lee Strobel. Third, an event called Day For The City.
