People in their 20's or early 30's who live in or near Midtown primarily make up the church family, and a rotation of three young men do most of the preaching. 
healing power in the life of one of His precious servants. Childcare is provided for all participants. We also hope to unveil newly formatted Men's and Women's Open Share Groups on this night.


