We invite you and your family to join us for dinner at 6 p.m., followed by a special time of worship and a powerful testimony of God's healing power in the life of one of His precious servants. Childcare is provided for all participants. Remember, *CR* is for anyone struggling with any hurt, hang-up, or habit. We hope you will consider joining us.

Croatia Missions Update

Mission work at Kuslanova Church of Christ, located in the east side of Zagreb (capital of Croatia with 0.8 million people), is going through new dynamics. Some ministries and activities stay active and vital, such as our Children's Ministry (called Champs Camp, reaching unchurched children up to 12 years and their families), Women's Ministry, *Let's Start Talking*, summer teen and family camps, spring retreats, and Bible Institute, all which operate in the same building as Kuslanova Church. Other opportunities are opening with broadcasting of Gospel messages at local TV stations, Men's Ministry, *Let's Start Talking* follow-up, various open classes and online classes at Bible Institute, Children and Teens Ministry on the west side of Zagreb, and social media evangelism.

HIM workers, Zachary & Savannah Shaffer, are a big part in making the mission work successful, especially with children and teens. *Let's Start Talking* follow-up is getting off the ground with the help of John & Susan Cooper leading small Bible study groups in English for LST readers. And on the west side of Zagreb, a completely new Teen Ministry is developing out of Champs Camp, led by Steve Taliaferro.

Disciple Making Movement is becoming a new mission field in reaching new people and equipping believers in their faith walk. Using media like social networks has become a new venue for identifying those who seek God and inviting them to Discovery Bible Study for finding truth about God and themselves.

With new opportunities, new challenges also arise and many prayers are needed. Please remember Croatia missions in your prayers


