MINISTRY UPDATES

Alzheimer's Caregiver Support Group Update

One thing I love about MRCC is that whenever there is a need identified amongst its members, efforts are made to meet that need! Over a year ago the Care and Counseling Ministry became aware of a great need for a support group for those caring for loved ones with Alzheimer's disease. Facilitators were found, a group was started, and much needed support was provided.

In March 2020, when the whole world changed due to COVID-19, our group quickly adapted to monthly Zoom meetings. Since March, the group has had to deal with extended physical separation from loved ones in nursing facilities, decline in the health of loved ones, death of a mate, etc. It has truly been a challenging time. As the members tend to their own loved ones, they also hope and pray for a cure to end Alzheimer's. That is why we walk on October 17. Money raised will go toward advancing research as well as funding services that are offered by the Alzheimer's Association. These services are free to all who reach out for information or help. This year our team is specifically honoring Doyce Walker, late husband of Linda Walker. Doyce passed in March of this year.

SERMON INFO

Today Phil continues the City on a Hill series by taking a deep dive into Romans 14-15. In these chapters, Paul deals with two groups of people within the Roman church which have significant disagreement about vital issues in their day. Paul's counsel on how they were to deal with their tension is rather unusual. Rather than siding with one party, Paul urges them to focus on the issues which bring them together instead of those which drive them apart. Phil will talk about how we might practice these principles in our currently divided society.

CITY ON A HILL

Questions for Reflection & Discussion

- Would you rather be friends with someone who shares your faith but not your politics, or someone who shares your politics but not your faith?
- What were some of your takeaways as to the background of the church at Rome?
- Phil talked about four divisive issues in the New Testament world: Election v. Inclusion, Anti-Empire v. Pro-Empire, Rich v. Poor, and Torah Obedience v. Torah Liberation. Briefly remind each other what these mean, and then share which you think caused the most division and why?
- How do you think deported Jews would have felt when they came back to church in Rome after being absent five years?
- In Romans 14, Paul acknowledged that both Rufus and Hermes (weak and the strong) carried out their beliefs "to the Lord." How might someone you disagree with view their own actions and beliefs as "to the Lord"?
- What are ways you see people today deepening the wedge or widening the bridge

when it comes to issues of disagreement?

- What is the application today of "Accept one another out of reference for Christ." (15:7). How does Paul's admonition here differ from blind acceptance of sinful behavior?
- Read Romans 14:1-4. What are the specific instructions Paul gives to those in disagreement? Which ones are hard to follow?
- Read Romans 14:22. When do you think Christians should keep quiet? When should they speak out?
