

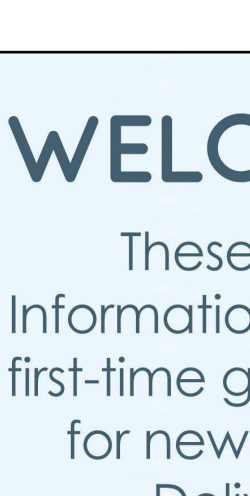

DISASTER RELIEF ASSISTANCE

In light of the damage done by Hurricane Ida along the Gulf Coast, many have asked about how they can help. Along with The Park congregation in Tulsa, we are in contact with the Carrollton Avenue Church of Christ in New Orleans and will forward funds we collect to them for dispersal to those in need.

If you'd like to donate funds for disaster relief, you can do so online at mrcc.org/give (tap on this item to follow the live link). You can also give cash (in an envelope marked "disaster relief") or checks (made out to MRCC and with "disaster relief" on the memo line). We will forward those funds to the Carrollton congregation.

If you are interested in helping with cleanup efforts, you can sign up to volunteer through the Disaster Response Team at www.churchesofchristdrt.org/. While we don't have plans for an MRCC-led trip at this point, we've partnered with DRT many times and they are good to work with.

SERMON INFO



Questions for Reflection & Discussion

- In honor of the prefix "pent-," try to think of five words with that prefix. Bonus: Try to fit all five words into one sentence.
- If you had to live one single day of your life over again, which day would you pick and why?
- Pentecost Trivia: What did Pentecost celebrate as a Jewish holiday? What landed on the heads of the disciples? What did the crowd accuse the disciples of? What time of day did the disciples reference in defending the accusation? From which two Old Testament passages did Peter quote? At the climax of Peter's sermon, Luke records that the people were cut to the what? What are the promises Peter mentions in connection with being baptized.
- Do you think it's possible for the events of Acts 2 to take place again in our day? Why or why not?
- Phil commented that God's main contribution to the opening day of the church was to break down the language barrier. What does this tell us about the heart of God? What are ways that we make onramps for people to know Christ? In what ways do we create barriers?
- What do you think the Christian response should be to Afghan refugees who will be coming into OKC in a month, many of whom will be Muslims?
- Of all the things Peter could have done and said in this opening sermon, he mainly quoted Old Testament passages and reflected on them. Why do you think he did this? What can we learn from it?
- When was a moment in your life where the word of God impacted you?
- Phil talked about three manifestations of the Holy Spirit from Acts 2. See if you can name them.
- Phil quoted 1 Thessalonians 5:19, in which Paul urges us to not quench the Spirit. What are ways we do quench the Spirit?
- Which role of the Spirit do you most need right now? Water (refreshment), Wind (movement), or Fire (refinement)?

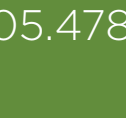
New Baby
