Members of OC's Eagles Health Initiative will be onsite next Sunday, Oct. 10, as we host a drive for anyone willing to join the National Blood Marrow Donor

Registry. Participants will undergo a simple and shallow

nose swab, which will be submitted for analysis and

entered into a national registry of donors. When

patients need a bone marrow transplant, they are tested

against this database in the hopes of finding a match.

Only 30% of patients can find bone marrow matches

among members of their family, so this registry is vital

to helping the remaining 70% of people diagnosed with

cancer. Most registered donors are

contacted, but a small number have the opportunity to

save a life! Marrow donation is never mandatory—even

after a match is found, the potential donor can opt out

if needed. The process to register only takes five

minutes. There is also a drive at OC's Garvey Center on

Monday, Oct. 11, from 11:30 a.m. — 4:00 p.m. Please

MINISTRY UPDATES AFGHAN REFUGEE ASSISTANCE The first of nearly 1000 Afghan refugees have started arriving in the metro area. An MRCC family has networked with Qgroup members, neighbors, family members, etc., to set up an apartment for one of the first refugee families. As we wait for information about additional refugees, the best ways you can help are by: 1. PRAYING that God will continue to open doors through this refugee resettlement. 2. Signing up for your Qgroup or family to ADOPT a refugee family, providing secondhand furniture and home furnishings as well as checking on the family from time to time (discover more details or sign up at mrcc.org/refugee). 3. CONTRIBUTING funds for refugee assistance (to be used for food, clothing, and other necessities) at mrcc.org/give or give cash or checks (marked "Refugee Assistance") to Tammy McKeever, Terry Fischer, or Clay Hart. Refugee assistance efforts are being coordinated by our Community Outreach and International Ministries. Funds given in excess of the needs, after a reasonable time, will be used to bless others through those ministries.
