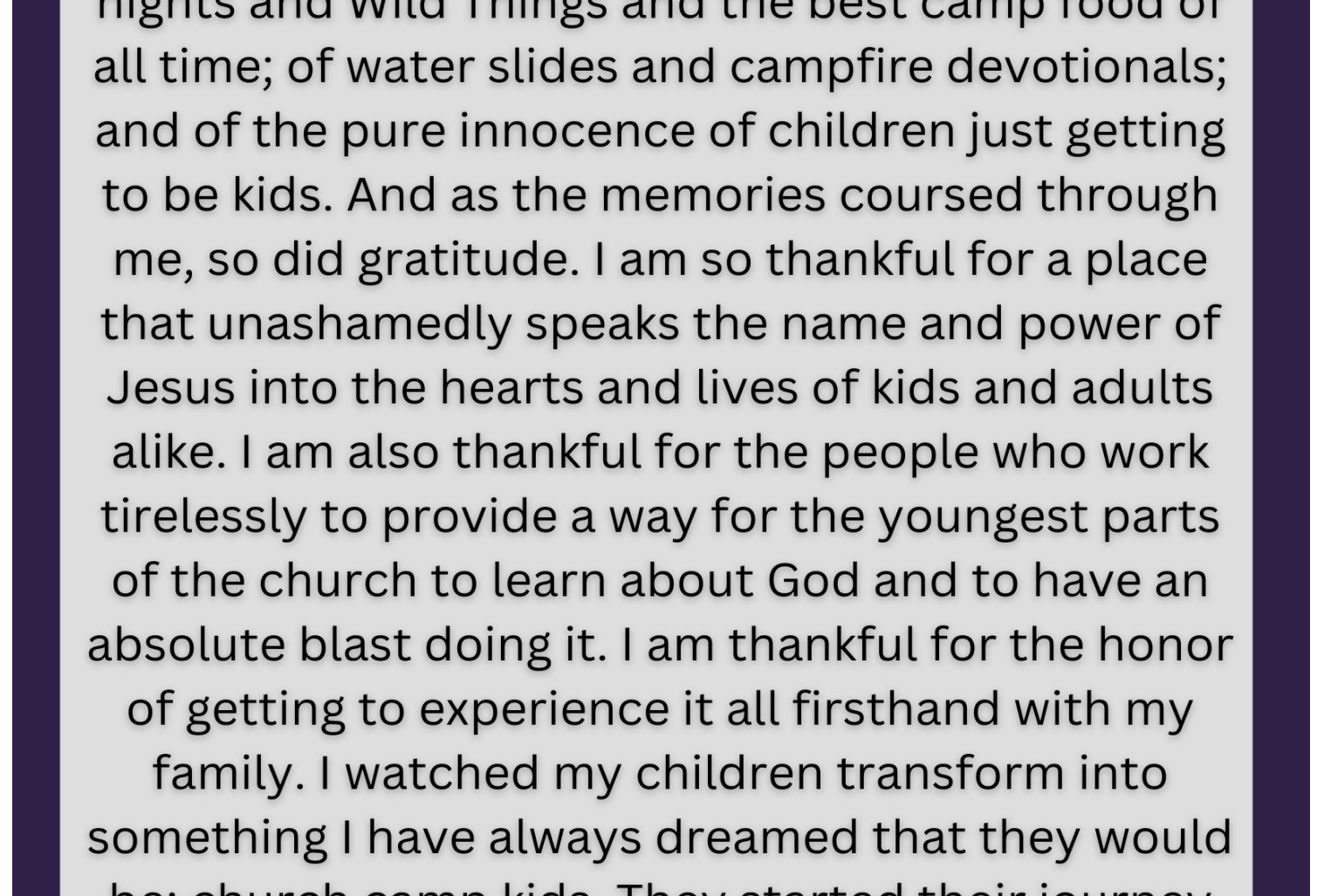
MINISTRY UPDATES



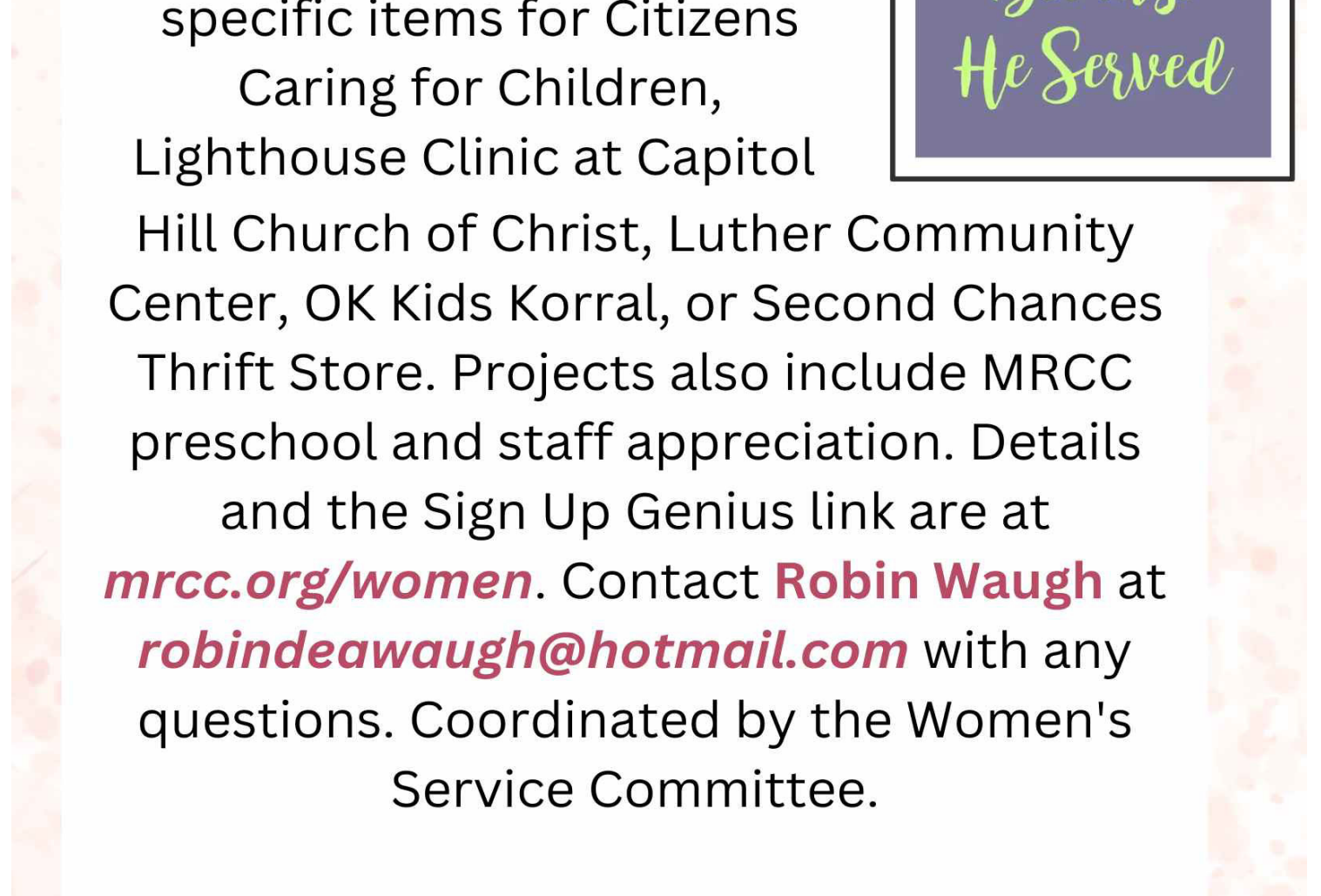
The Memphis Mission Trip is something I looked forward to this year, and I caught myself counting down the days for when we were leaving for the trip. The youth group, the sponsors, the interns, and Daniel and Emily make the trip so meaningful and always bring God into what we are doing. Not only does the church family make the trip so impactful, but it's also the people we meet along the way.

In Memphis, we partner with a nonprofit organization called Agape. Agape partners with all different organizations around Memphis, such as schools, churches, and food banks. Throughout the week, we split up into four different groups to serve in different places. This year, our church went to two different VBS's, a food bank, and a middle school. We were able to paint with projects all along the spectrum. I helped paint a middle school locker room as well as their school logo. At the food bank, we helped package the food for the families, who would stop by almost daily for their meals. We would greet them and get a chance to hear these people's life stories. It is an amazing thing to just be able to sit and listen to someone talk about a life that isn't even relatively close to yours. It makes me incredibly grateful for what I have, and I realize that God really will take care of you even in the hardest circumstances.

I learned that even though I am only here for one week, I want those I encounter to not necessarily remember me, but that I had Jesus in me and that it reflected in everything that I did. I hope that these kids can see how much God can impact you if you hold a strong faith through life's ups and downs. Towards the end of the week, the kids truly show their personalities, and it is hard to say goodbye, but you feel like you have left a mark. 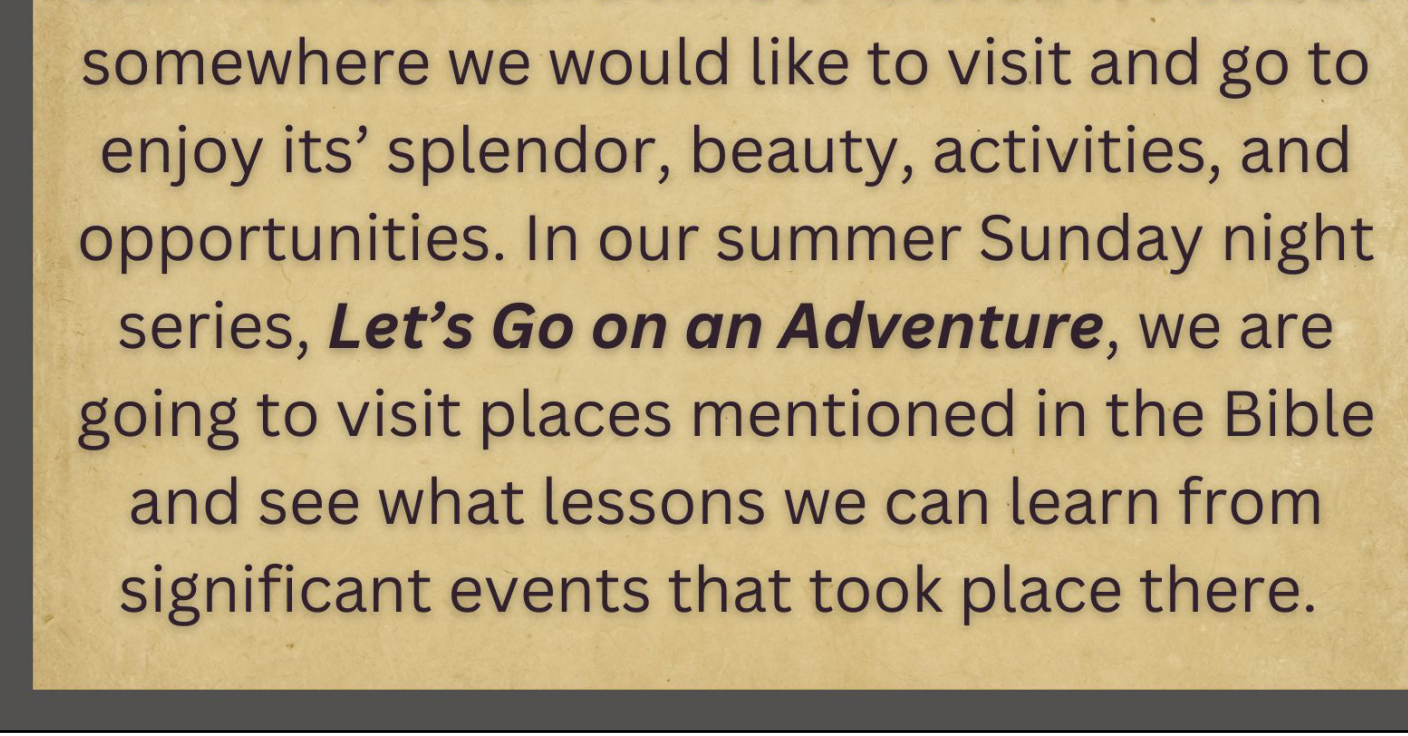

HALLELUJAH TO THE KING

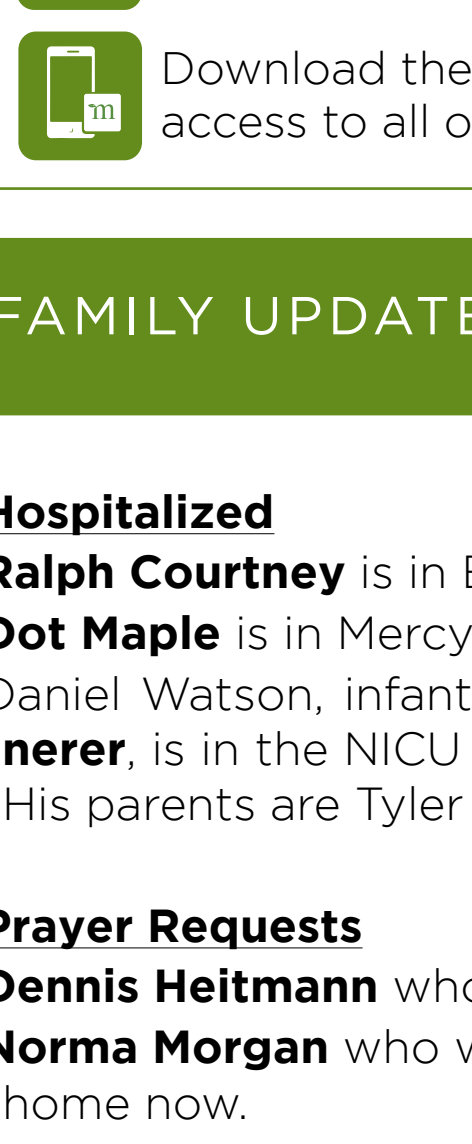

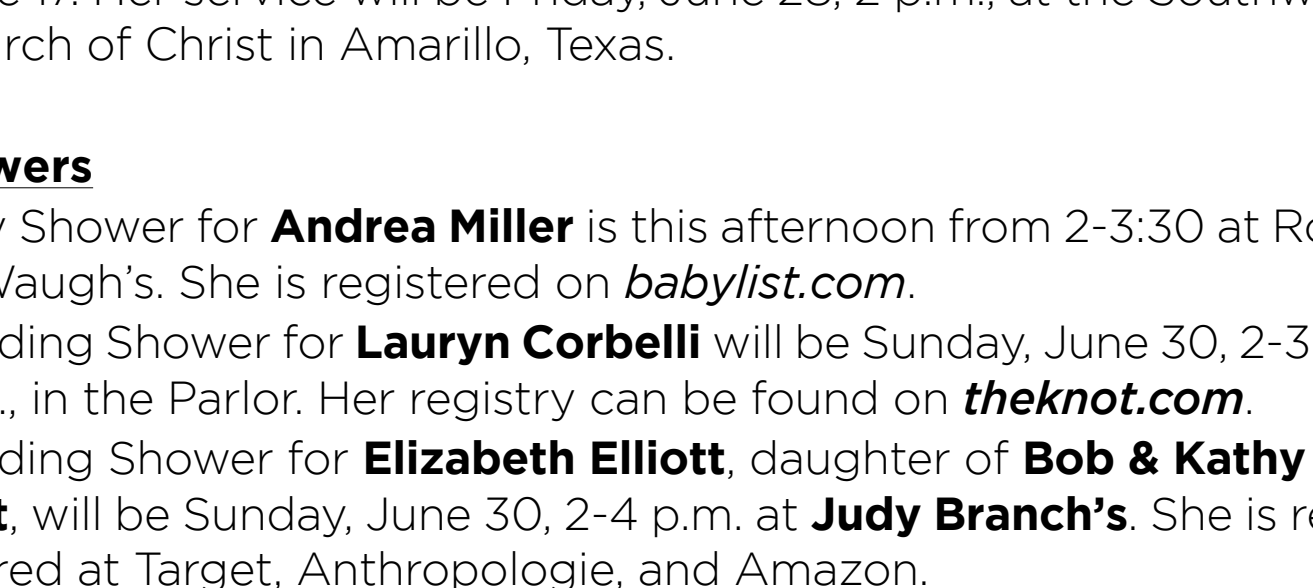
